Keswick was derived from the name of a town in Cumbria, England, which is well-known for its beautiful and picturesque scenery. In 1875, young people of this place held their first Keswick convention. It was held in a tent on the lawn of St. John's vicarage. Keswick got underway with a prayer service on the evening of June 28 of the same year. This event, which drew 400 young people, still bears the subject and motto "All One in Christ Jesus" today.

Before the term "Keswick" became famous in the Philippines, the phrase "Ambassadors for Christ" (AFC) initially gained popularity. A small number of young people and Doane Evangelistic Institute students got together on Sunday afternoons for games, drills, and Bible studies. Before long, this was supported by some of the Association of Baptists for World Evangelism (ABWE) Missionaries. It was first known as "Christian Endeavor Society," but it was later renamed "Ambassadors for Christ" based on 2 Corinthians 5:20.

AFC activities expanded and the need to merge the local organizations for fellowship among the young people of Visayan Fellowship of Fundamental Baptist Churches (VFFBC) grew. In 1950, the first Keswick Bible Camp was held in Good Shepherd's Fold Academy, Buenavista, Guimaras on December 26-30, 1950. The first president of the WVFAC was one of the young people in the person of Antolin Zamar.

As the years went by, a lot of ideas were exchanged and the number of delegates grew from hundreds to thousands. It was suggested that the 43rd Keswick, which was held in Valladolid, Negros Occidental, in December 1992, be renamed to the Annual Youth Conference. However, "Several attempts were made in the past to change the name Keswick for something of local significance, but these were not materialized. I guess it is because the word Keswick has become so much part of us as it really is.

Only eternity can tell how many lives were changed for God's glory in this annual youth gathering," as the former president said.

The world we live in is loud—even deafening at times. But the peace of God's Word turns down the noise, offering tranquil truth and beauty in place of clamor. **Psalms 19:7-8** is a reminder that Scripture provides us with wisdom and clarity by:

Restoring the Soul. God's Word has everything our wounded and weary souls need. When life's struggles wear us down, it brings restoration by providing comfort, hope, and renewal.

Making Wise the Simple. The insight and guidance contained in Scripture surpass worldly knowledge. God's wisdom is not exclusive to the educated or elite but is offered to anyone willing to receive it.

Rejoicing the Heart. The precepts of the Lord are right, reminding us of our identity and purpose in Christ. This brings lasting joy in a world filled with temporary pleasures.

Enlightening the Eyes. The commandment of the Lord is pure and teaches us spiritual truths. When we seek God's guidance in His Word, we gain clarity and perspective, which help us navigate through confusion and darkness.

God's Word is truly a precious and beautiful gift—it is a source of strength and a light for our path.



Scripture: **2 Timothy 2:15**

Source: **Ian Rush; Faith Bible Church; God's Word Is All You Need**

Theologian B.B. Warfield helpfully states,

"What it says of Scripture is, not that it is 'breathed into by God' or is the product of the divine 'inbreathing' into its human authors, but that it is breathed out by God, 'God breathed,' the product of the creative breath of God. In a word, what is declared by this fundamental passage is simply that the scriptures are a divine product, without any indication of how God has operated in producing them."

What a wonderful and essential truth, that the ultimate origin of all of the Bible is God! And because all of the Bible comes from God:

- We can trust that it contains no error and we must believe it.
- We can't just dismiss what it says as we can with "man-breathed" books. It comes from the eternal God of this universe, and we had better respect it, be in awe of it, and submit to it because we respect, worship, and submit to Him.
- The Bible is the ultimate standard of truth because it comes from the one who is the ultimate authority over all other "truths." If anything we hear, see, or experience contradicts the Bible, the Bible remains true and the other experience is certainly false or has been misinterpreted.
- We can trust that the words and message of the Bible are a revelation of the character of God. If we want to know Him, all we need to do is read the words He has breathed out.
- We can trust that because His Word reveals that He is good, everything He instructs us to do in His Word is therefore for our good.

Paul goes on to tell Timothy that Scripture is therefore ***"profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work"*** (2 Timothy 3:16-17).

If there's anything we need in this life, it is the Word of God. Jesus himself said, ***"Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God"*** (Matthew 4:4).



"Jesus at the Center: Living by God's Word"

Key Verse:

"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." — Psalm 119:105

In a world overflowing with opinions, trends, and pressures, God has given young people one unchanging guide—the Scriptures. The Word of God does not simply give advice; it gives life, direction, correction, and strength. Everything in the Christian life is anchored in God's Word: salvation, growth, holiness, purpose, and hope.

Jonathan Edwards once said, **"The Scriptures are the fountain of divine truth."** If the Bible is the fountain, then spiritual dryness often comes when we drink too little from it. John Stott added, **"The authority of Scripture is not tyranny but liberation."** God's Word does not restrict you—it frees you to become everything He designed you to be.

Make Scripture your priority—not just something you read, but something you live. When God's Word becomes central, your decisions become clearer, your temptations become weaker, and your purpose becomes stronger.

PRAYER

Lord, help me treasure Your Word above all. Make Your truth central in my decisions, desires, and daily life. Give me a heart that listens, obeys, and delights in Your voice. Amen.

"Wholehearted in God's Word: Embracing All Scripture"

Key Verse:

"All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness." — 2 Timothy 3:16

Young people today often pick and choose verses that feel comforting, but God calls us to embrace the totality of Scripture—all of it. The Bible is not a buffet; it is God's complete revelation for life and godliness. Every page—from Genesis to Revelation—speaks with divine authority.

John MacArthur reminds us, ***"We don't stand over the Word of God; the Word of God stands over us."*** That means we don't edit the Bible to fit our lifestyle—we let the Bible shape our lifestyle. John Piper likewise said, ***"If you want the fullest joy, the deepest life, and the strongest hope, live in all of Scripture, not just parts of it."***

Hard passages build conviction. Encouraging passages build comfort. Doctrinal passages build stability. Together, they build a complete follower of Christ. Let God's whole Word shape your whole life.

PRAYER

Father, thank You for giving me all of Scripture. Teach me to love every chapter, every truth, every command, and every promise. Make me a young person who lives under the fullness of Your Word. Amen.
